

Whitehouse, in the County of Antrim, Farmer and widower, by his last Will, dated the 23rd day of August, 1939, gave and bequeathed, amongst other legacies the undernoted charitable bequests:—

1. "One Hundred Pounds to the Salvation Army for its general purposes in Belfast and district, the receipt of the officer in charge of the Salvation Army in Belfast to be a sufficient discharge to my Trustees."

2. "All the rest, residue and remainder of my estate I leave and bequeath to the Royal Victoria Hospital, Belfast (the receipt of the Treasurer of said Hospital to be a sufficient discharge therefor to my Trustees)."

By a Codicil to his said Will, dated the 29th day of January, 1940, the testator gave and bequeathed the following charitable bequest:—

"I also leave and bequeath the sum of Two Hundred Pounds to the Trustees of Whitehouse Presbyterian Church, of which my Executor, the Rev. James Nutt, is at present the Minister, the income of said legacy to be paid to the Minister for the time being of said Church as an addition to his income, the receipt of the Treasurer of said Church to be a sufficient discharge to my Executors."

Testator died on the 29th day of June, 1940, and Probate of his said Will, with two Codicils thereto, was granted on the 16th day of August, 1940, forth of the Principal Probate Registry of the High Court of Justice in Northern Ireland, King's Bench Division (Probate) to the Reverend James Nutt, of Whitehouse, Presbyterian Minister, and George

Dinsmore, of Larne, Retired Sea Captain, both in the County of Antrim, the Executors named in the said Will.
