MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS. SUMMARY JURISDICTION. PETTY SESSIONS TIMES.

Order, dated 21st August, 1941, made by the Ministry of Home Affairs under the Summary Jurisdiction and Criminal Justice Act (Northern Ireland), 1935.

In pursuance of the provisions of Subsection (1) of Section 10 of the Summary Jurisdiction and Criminal Justice Act (Northern Ireland), 1935, the Ministry of Home Affairs, after consultation with the County Court Judges and the Resident Magistrates, hereby orders and directs as follows:—

When the time fixed or appointed for the holding of Petty Sessions for any district falls on Christmas Day or Good Friday the time fixed or appointed for the holding of such Petty Sessions shall be altered to the time fixed or appointed for the next following holding of Petty Sessions for that district.
