This day His Grace the Governor of Northern Ireland was pleased, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty the King, to give his Assent to the following Bills agreed upon by both Houses of the Parliament of Northern Ireland :--

Expiring Laws Continuance, Liabilities (War-Time Adjustment), Excessive Rents (Prevention), Appropriation (No. 2), Exported Animals (Compensation), Air-Raid Precautions (Postponement of Financial Investigation).

#### NOTIFICATION OF A STATE OF WAR WITH BULGARIA.

His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom have been informed by the Government of the United States, who were in charge of British interests in Bulgaria, that a declaration of war by that country on Great Britain was announced in the Bulgarian Parliament on the 13th December. His Majesty's Government have so far received no official communication to this effect from the Bulgarian Government, but in view of the above information it is hereby notified that a state of war exists between the two countries as from the 13th December.
