CIVIL AUTHORITIES (SPECIAL POWERS) ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1922 and 1933.

Whereas there is reason to believe that assemblies of persons have been or are about to be convened for the purpose of holding meetings or processions in Northern Ireland to commemorate the rebellion of Easter Week, 1916, or for the promotion of the objects of the Irish Republican Army or any other unlawful Association:

And whereas there is reason to apprehend that such assemblies of persons and the holding of such meetings or processions will give rise to grave disorder or conduce to a breach of the peace or promote disaffection and thereby cause undue demands to be made upon the Police Force:

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Sir Richard Dawson Bates, Bart., D.L., M.P., Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, being the Civil Authority under the said Acts, do hereby in accordance with the provisions of Regulation 4 of the Regulations made under the authority of the above-mentioned Acts, prohibit the holding of any such assemblies, meetings or processions in Northern Ireland during the period from the 1st day of April, 1942, to the 8th day of April, 1942, both dates inclusive.

DEFENCE (FINANCE) REGULATIONS, 1939. TREASURY DIRECTION UNDER REGULATION 3C (3A).

The Treasury, in pursuance of their powers under paragraph (3A) of Regulation 3C of the Defence (Finance) Regulations, 1939, hereby direct that in any case where all the personal representatives of a deceased person are resident in the sterling area for the purposes of the said Regulation and of any order providing for exemptions from any of the provisions thereof they shall be treated for the purposes aforesaid as being resident in the sterling area (and not elsewhere) so far as relates to any transactions in which they are concerned solely in their capacity as such personal representatives, notwithstanding that the deceased person may have been resident outside the sterling area for the purposes aforesaid at the time of his death.

STATUTORY RULES AND ORDERS OF NORTHERN IRELAND, 1942, No. 40, EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE).

FOOD (FEEDING STUFFS) GENERAL LICENCE AND DIRECTION

General Licence and Direction, dated March 18th, 1942, under The Feeding Stuffs (Control) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1941.

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland in pursuance of Article 2 of The Feeding Stuffs (Control) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1941 (a), hereby orders as follows:—

1. Every licence granted or to be granted for the purpose of the said Article 2 shall be deemed to include, in addition to the conditions subject to which it was granted, the following condition, that is to say, a condition that the holder of the licence shall accept delivery and take possession of any feeding stuffs tendered to him for the purposes of The Feeding Stuffs (Rationing) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1941 (b), as hereinafter provided:—
 - (a) where a licence holder or his servant has been notified by a person, Company or
