DRESSMAKING AND WOMEN'S LIGHT CLOTHING TRADE BOARD (NORTHERN IRELAND).

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES.

The Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Trade Board (Northern Ireland) hereby give notice that they propose to vary minimum rates of wages for male and female workers in the Factory Branch of the trade.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to their proposals which may be lodged with them within fourteen days from the 11th April, 1942. It is desirable that persons making objections should state the precise grounds of their objections.

EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE).
RESTRICTION OF TRAFFIC.

The Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland has made an Order dated 13th April, 1942, under Regulation 70 of the Defence (General)

Regulations, 1939, restricting traffic on a portion of the road in the townland of Hillsborough, Co Down, known as the Monument Road.

NOTE.—The following diseases have not appeared in Northern Ireland since the year shown after each disease:—Rinderpest (Pestis Bovina), 1877; Pleuro-Pneumonia (Peripneumonia contagiosa bovum), 1893; Sheep Pox (Variola ovium), 1850; Rabies (Rage), 1923; and Glanders (including Farcy) (Malleus), 1910. Epizootic Lymphangitis (Lymphangitis Epizootica) and Dourine have never existed in Northern Ireland.
