FIRE PREVENTION.

Notice is hereby given that the Ministry of Public Security for Northern Ireland has made a Direction under Article 4 of the Fire Prevention (Government Premises) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1942, as amended by the Fire Prevention (Government Premises) (Northern Ireland) (Amendment) Order, 1942, exempting from fire prevention duties any person holding a commission in the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, the Territorial Army Reserve, or the Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, who is posted for duty (whether whole-time or part-time) with the Sea Cadet Corps, the Army Cadet Force, or the Air Training Corps.
