FIRE PREVENTION.

Notice is hereby given that the Ministry of Public Security for Northern Ireland has made a Direction under Article 4 of the Fire Prevention (Government Premises) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1942, as amended by the Fire Prevention (Government Premises) (Northern Ireland) (Amendment) Order, 1942, exempting from fire prevention duties any person holding a commission in the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, the Territorial Army Reserve, or the Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, who is posted for duty (whether whole-time or part-time) with the Sea Cadet Corps, the Army Cadet Force, or the Air Training Corps. The Direction also gives, subject to certain conditions, exemption from fire prevention duties to any person who is enrolled as an instructor or as a Cadet in any of the said Organisations.

KING'S BENCH DIVISION-IN BANKRUPTCY
