

- (c) £50 to Rev. Michael Kelly, C.C., Newcastle, for a like purpose.
 (d) £50 to Rev. J. McCreesh, C.C., Glenavy, Co. Antrim, for a like purpose.
 (e) After payment thereof of funeral expenses and debts of Testator's wife, to pay the balance to the Roman Catholic Bishop of the Diocese of Down and Connor and the Roman Catholic Parish Priest of the Parish of Ballykinler, at the time of the death of Testator's wife, to be invested by them and the income paid by them to the Parish Priest and Catholic Curate for the time being of the Parish of Ballykinler, for ever, to have Masses celebrated in Ireland for the repose of the souls of Testator's wife, and himself.

2. To Testator's Trustees, a sum of £1,200 charged on his two farms in Ballykinler Middle, upon trust, for the Roman Catholic Bishop of the Diocese of Down and Connor at time of Testator's death, to be invested by him and the income thereof paid in equal shares to the Parish Priest and Catholic Curate of the Parish of Ballykinler, for the time being, for ever, to have Masses celebrated in Ireland for the repose of the souls of Testator, and his deceased relatives.

To the Trustees of Drumbo Presbyterian Church two sums of Two hundred and fifty pounds each to be invested by them and half the income of the first of such sums to be applied for the benefit of the said Church and the other half to be applied in augmentation of the stipend of the Minister for the time being of said Church, and the income of the second of such sums to be applied for the benefit of the Drumbo Sabbath School in such manner as the Trustees think proper and to the Trustees of the said Church a further sum of Two hundred pounds to be likewise invested by the said Trustees and the income thereof applied by them for the benefit of Foreign Missions in connection with the Presbyterian Church in Ireland.

4. And after certain other bequests, Testator bequeathed the residue of his estate to the Trustees of Drumbo Presbyterian Church for the purpose of the installation of a pipe organ in the said Church to be known as "The Robinson Memorial Pipe Organ."
