A PROCLAMATION.

APPOINTING SATURDAY, THE EIGHTH DAY OF JUNE, ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FORTY-SIX, A BANK HOLIDAY THROUGHOUT THE UNITED KINGDOM FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE BANK HOLIDAYS ACT, 1871.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS we consider it desirable that Saturday, the eighth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and forty-six, shall be kept as a close holiday in all Banks in the United Kingdom and shall, as regards Bills of Exchange and promissory notes payable in the United Kingdom, be deemed to be a bank holiday for all the purposes of the Bank Holidays Act, 1871:

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred by section four of the said Act, We do by this our Royal Proclamation, by and with the advice of our Privy Council, appoint the said eighth day of June to be observed as a bank holiday throughout the United Kingdom.

Given at our Court at Buckingham Palace, this twenty-seventh day of March, in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and forty-six, and in the tenth year of Our Reign.
