To all others whom it may concern:

The Ministry of Home Affairs in exercise of
the powers vested in it by the Local Government
Acts (Northern Ireland), 1898 to 1923, the
Londonderry Bridge Act (Northern Ireland),
1922, and of all other powers enabling the
Ministry in this behalf, hereby orders and
directs as follows, that is to say:—

1. This Order may be cited as the London-
derry Bridge Commissioners (Accounts)
(No. 1) Order, 1923.

2. The provisions of Section 11 to Section
18 of the Local Government (Ireland) Act,
1871, as amended by Section 6 of the Local
Government Board (Ireland) Act, 1872, or
any subsequent enactment including the pro-
visions of those sections which impose
penalties or provide for the recovery of sums
shall apply to the audit of the accounts of
the Londonderry Bridge Commissioners.

To all others whom it may concern:

WHEREAS by the Londonderry Bridge
Commissioners (Accounts) (No. 1) Order, 1923,
the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern
Ireland did apply to the audit of the Accounts
of the Londonderry Bridge Commissioners the
provisions of Section 11 to Section 18 of the
Local Government (Ireland) Act, 1871, as
amended by Section 6 of the Local Government
Board (Ireland) Act, 1872, or any subsequent
enactment including the provisions of those
sections which impose penalties or provide for
the recovery of sums;

Now, Therefore, the Ministry of Home Affairs
for Northern Ireland in exercise of the powers
vested in it by the Local Government Acts
(Northern Ireland), 1898 to 1923, the London-
derry Bridge Act (Northern Ireland), 1922,
and of all other powers enabling the Ministry
in this behalf, hereby orders and directs as
follows, that is to say:—

1. This Order may be cited as the London-
derry Bridge Commissioners (Accounts)
(No. 2) Order, 1923.

2. The Public Bodies Order, 1904, and the
appropriate forms contained in the said
Order, shall so far as the same may be applic-
able apply with the necessary modifications
to the said Accounts, subject to such altera-
tions and omissions as may from time to
time be approved of by the Ministry.

THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR

To the several Education Committees, Urban
and County Technical Instruction Com-
mittees, and School Attendance Committees
and their Officers in Northern Ireland; and
To all others whom it may concern:

WHEREAS the Ministry of Home Affairs
for Northern Ireland by an Order under Seal
bearing date the 12th day of September, 1922,
did order and direct that the Declaration of
Allegiance made and subscribed by officers of
the aforesaid Committees or Joint-Committees
be made in duplicate, and that the duplicate
copy be forwarded to the said Ministry within
seven days after it has been duly made and
subscribed;

And Whereas the said Ministry of Home
Affairs by a further Order bearing date the
Sixth day of January, 1923, did order and
direct that the secretary or clerk of every
committee or joint committee wholly or partly
appointed by a local authority should, within
seven days after the expiration of the period
prescribed for the making of the Declaration
of Allegiance, furnish to the said Ministry in
the appropriate form set out in the Schedule
to that Order, or in a form to like effect, a
certificate showing whether or not each person
elected or chosen or appointed to be a member
of the committee or joint committee, as the
case may be, had made and subscribed the
Declaration of Allegiance within the prescribed
time and in the prescribed manner;
