STATUTORY RULES AND ORDERS OF NORTHERN IRELAND, 1946. MECHANICALLY PROPELLED VEHICLES DUTY.

CYLINDER CAPACITY DUTY.

The Cylinder Capacity Duty (Appointed Day) Order, 1946, dated July 22nd, 1946, made by the Ministry of Finance under paragraph 5 of the Second Schedule to the Finance Act, 1920 (10 and 11 Geo. 5, Ch. 18) as amended by Section 1 (1) of the Finance Act (Northern Ireland), 1946 (9 and 10 Geo. 6, Ch. 1).

The Ministry of Finance, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by paragraph 5 of the Second Schedule to the Finance Act, 1920 (as amended by Section 1 (1) of the Finance Act (Northern Ireland), 1946, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. The Appointed Day for the purposes of the proviso to the said paragraph 5 shall be the 1st day of January, 1947.

2. This Order may be cited as the Cylinder Capacity Duty (Appointed Day) Order (Northern Ireland), 1946.

WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945.

LINEN AND COTTON EMBROIDERY WAGES COUNCIL (NORTHERN IRELAND).

The Linen and Cotton Embroidery Wages Council (Northern Ireland) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance proposals for the revocation of the Orders N.I.E. (24) dated 13th May, 1940, and N.I.E. (26) dated 1st April, 1943, and for the fixing of statutory minimum remuneration in substitution for the minimum rates of wages at present in operation.

Particulars of the proposals may be obtained from the Secretary of the Wages Council at the address given below.

The Wages Council will consider any written representations with respect to the above-mentioned proposals which may be sent to it within twenty-one days from 25th July, 1946. Any such representation should be signed by the person making the same (adding his or her address) and sent to the Secretary, Linen and Cotton Embroidery Wages Council (Northern Ireland), Tyrone House, Ormeau Avenue, Belfast. It is desirable that persons making objections should state the precise grounds of their objections.
