A PROCLAMATION

FOR APPOINTING SATURDAY, JULY 12TH, 1947, A BANK HOLIDAY AND A PUBLIC HOLIDAY IN NORTHERN IRELAND.

I, William Spencer, Earl Granville, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Vice-Admiral, Governor of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland in pursuance of the Bank Holidays Act, 1871, the Holidays Extension Act, 1875, and the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, and of every power me thereunto enabling, Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, and of every power me thereunto enabling, do hereby appoint Saturday, the Twelfth day of July next, as a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday and as a Public Holiday in Northern Ireland, under and in accordance with the said Acts, and I do by this Proclamation command the said day to be so observed, and all loving subjects of His Majesty to order themselves accordingly. Given at Government House, Hillsborough, this twenty-fourth day of June, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-seven.

MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT FOR NORTHERN IRELAND. BALLYCASTLE URBAN DISTRICT.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS (N.I.), 1878 to 1946.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Minister of Health and Local Government for Northern Ireland has made an Order declaring Sections 81, 82 and Ballycastle as and from the 1st July, 1947.

The Ministry of Health and Local Government has also made an Order declaring Sections 23 and 27 of the above-mentioned Act to be in force in

27 of the above-mentioned Act to be in force in the same Urban District as and from the 1st July, 1947.

Section 23 defines what is to be deemed new buildings; Section 27 grants certain powers with regard to temporary buildings; Section 81 extends the definition of public place and street for certain purposes; Sections 82 and 83 grant certain powers with regard to the seasons and propegade with regard to the seashore and promenade.
