The Ministry of Health and Local Government gives notice, in pursuance of the above-named Regulations, that it hereby recognises the Official Certificate of which particulars are given in the Schedule hereto as showing (a) that the meat from which the meat product to which the certificate relates was prepared, was derived from animals inspected ante and post mortem and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Ministry; and (b) that all necessary precautions for the

prevention of danger to public health were taken in the dressing or preparing and packing of the meat product.

The certificate is in the form of a stamp which will be impressed upon the meat or the package containing the meat or meat product and will apply only if the stamp is clearly impressed on the meat or the container as the case may be.

## THE MILK CONTROL AND MAXIMUM PRICES) (NORTHERN IRELAND) ORDER, 1945

## GRADE A MILK IN CARTONS.

In exercise of the authority vested in it by Article 20 of the Milk (Control and Maximum Prices) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1945, (a) as amended, and of all other powers enabling it, the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland hereby licenses each milk distributor who sells by retail Grade A milk contained in cartons to make, in addition to the maximum price, a charge in respect of cartons at a rate not exceeding sixpence for each gallon of milk delivered by him.
