EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875.

WHEREAS Sergeant William Randel Woddell McDowell (No. 4269) of the Royal Ulster Constabulary, was on the 25th September, 1946, appointed to be an Inspector for Northern Ireland under the Explosives Act, 1875 :

AND WHEREAS the said Sergeant William Randel Woddell McDowell is no longer available for the duties of Inspector :

Now I, the Right Hon. Edmond Warnock, K.C., M.P., being the Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in virtue of the power conferred on me by Section 53 of the said Act and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, do hereby order that the said Sergeant William Randel Woddell McDowell shall from this day cease to exercise the powers and perform the duties of an Inspector under the said Act.

EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875.

In virtue of the power conferred on me by Section 53 of the Explosives Act, 1875, and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, I, the Rt. Hon. Edmond Warnock, K.C., M.P., being the Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, hereby appoint Sergeant David Henry Johnston (No. 5355) of the Royal Ulster Constabulary, as an Inspector for Northern Ireland under the said Act, and do hereby direct him to exercise only

such powers and to perform such duties under the said Act as I shall from time to time assign to him.

PUBLIC HEALTH (TUBERCULOSIS) ACT  
(NORTHERN IRELAND), 1946.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 6th day of August, 1947, the Ministry of Health and Local Government for Northern Ireland, in exercise of its powers under the Public Health (Tuberculosis) Act (Northern Ireland), 1946, made regulations entitled the Public Health (Tuberculosis) (Appointed Day No. 3), Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1947.

The effect of the regulations is to bring the Act into full operation on 1st September, 1947, and thus to enable the Northern Ireland Tuberculosis Authority to take over from the county and county borough councils the full responsibility of prevention and treatment of tuberculosis in Northern Ireland.
