To the Session and Committee of the Reformed Presbyterian Church, Dromara, County Down, the sum of £100 stg., to be applied by them for the benefit of said Church as they may in their discretion think right.

charitable Institutions and Churches should be a sufficient discharge to his Executors for the various bequests to them.
