GENERAL WASTE MATERIALS RECLAMA-TION WAGES COUNCIL (NORTHERN IRELAND).

The General Waste Materials Reclamation Wages Council (Northern Ireland) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance proposals for the amendment of the General Waste Materials Reclamation Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation Order, 1946 (S.R. & O. 1946, No. 159), date 9th October, 1946.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury give notice that they have made an Order under Section 10 (5) of the Finance Act, 1926, exempting alcohol furfuryl, and the following ethyl ester, namely, diethyl sulphate (ethyl sulphate), from Key Industry Duty for the period beginning with
