## ANCIENT MONUMENTS ADVISORY COUNCIL

Whereas by Section 13 of the Ancient Monuments Act (Northern Ireland), 1926, as amended by Section 1 of the Ancient Monuments Act (Northern Ireland), 1937, it is provided that the Minister of Finance shall appoint the Ancient Monuments Advisory Council for the purposes of the said Acts, and that the said Council shall consist of members representing the bodies named in the First Schedule to the Act of 1926, the curators of certain Museums, and such other members as the Minister may appoint.

And whereas the Belfast Natural History and Philosophical Society has nominated Professor T. A. Sinclair, M.A., 8 Malone Hill Park, Belfast, as its representative.

Now I, the Right Honourable J. Maynard Sinclair, D.L., Minister of Finance, do hereby appoint Professor T. A. Sinclair, M.A., to be a member of the Ancient Monuments Advisory Council.

## GOVERNMENT OF NORTHERN IRELAND DRAINAGE ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1947

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland hereby gives notice, in pursuance of Section 5 (1)(b) of the Drainage Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, that a Scheme has been prepared for the better drainage

of part of the Big Drain, County Londonderry, which the Drainage Council have declared to be a main watercourse within the meaning of Section 1 (1) of the Act. The part of the watercourse to be dealt with under the Scheme is:—

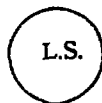
That part of the Big Drain which flows from a point approximately 340 yards downstream of Tircreven Bridge to the point where it enters Lough Foyle between the townlands of Tircreven, Clooney, Lower Ballyleighery, Duncrun, Margymonaghan, Ballmulholland and Drumahorgan.

A copy of the Scheme may be inspected free of charge by any person during the period from 9th December, 1948, to 8th January, 1949, inclusive, at the Offices of the County Surveyor, Courthouse, Coleraine, between the hours of 9.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. on weekdays and 9.30 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Saturdays.

Any person who considers that his interests will be prejudicially affected by the Scheme may at any time within one month after the date of the publication of this notice send to the Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture, 4 Upper Crescent, Belfast, all such (if any) observations in regard to the Scheme as he shall think proper.
