## WILD BIRDS PROTECTION ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1931

WHEREAS under Section ten of the Wild Birds Protection Act (Northern Ireland), 1931, I, the Right Honourable Brian Maginess, Minister of Home Affairs, may "by Order direct that the district defined by the Order shall be a Bird Sanctuary and all birds with or without any specified exceptions, shall in that district be deemed to be classified in Category I, and on the making of any such Order this Act shall in that district have effect accordingly."
