Public Health (Imported Food) Regulations, (Northern Ireland), 1937 and 1948

(NORTHERN IRELAND), 1937 AND 1948

The Ministry of Health and Local Government gives notice, in pursuance of the above-named Regulations that it hereby recognises the Official Certificate, of which particulars are given in the Schedule hereto, as showing (a) that the meat from which the meat product to which the certificate relates was prepared, was derived from animals inspected ante and post mortem and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Ministry and (b) that all necessary precautions for prevention of danger to public health were taken in the preparing and packing of the meat product.

The Certificate being in the form of a stamp, recognition will apply only if the stamp is clearly impressed on the package containing the meat product and the stamp has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate.
