MOTOR VEHICLE LICENCES: HARVESTING OPERATIONS
CONCESSION

Order, dated 1st May, 1950, made by the Ministry of Finance under Section 1 of the Finance (No. 2) Act (Northern Ireland), 1943.

1. Where any crop is being harvested upon any land in Northern Ireland a mechanically-propelled vehicle licensed under sub-division (1) of paragraph 4 of the Second Schedule to the Finance Act, 1920 (which specifies the rates of duty to be charged on vehicles registered in the name of a person engaged in agriculture and used on roads solely by that person for the purpose of the conveyance of the produce of, or of articles required for the purpose of, the agricultural land which he occupies) may without further duty be used (whether by the person in whose name it is registered or not) for the purpose of conveying in the course of such harvesting or of any operations incidental thereto:—

- (a) the produce of that land;
- (b) any articles required for the purposes of that land.

2. This Order may be cited as "The Motor Vehicle Licences: Harvesting Operations Concession (Northern Ireland) Order, 1950," and shall continue in force from 12th July, 1950, until 28th November, 1950.

DISPOSAL OF SURPLUS BUILDINGS

In pursuance of Section 3(3) of the Industries Development Act, 1945, the Ministry of Commerce hereby gives notice of its intention to dispose of buildings Nos. 24, 27, 32, 33, 37, 38, 39 and 40, situated on the Newtownards Airport Factory Estate, Comber Road, Newtownards. These buildings are as follows:—

BUILDING NO.	DESCRIPTION
24	Brick building (26ft. x 19ft. x 10½ft. to eaves), cement rendered to exterior, standard corrugated asbestos pitched roof on wood purlins and two steel trusses, plasterboard ceiling, steel windows, wood doors, concrete floor, small brick porch to one end (5½ft. x 7½ft. x 10½ft. to eaves) with lean-to corrugated asbestos roof.
27	Brick building (11ft. x 19ft. x 7½ft. to eaves), cement rendered to exterior and part interior, standard corrugated asbestos pitched roof on wood purlins, flat asbestos ceiling, wood framed fixed window, wood doors, concrete floor.
32	Brick building (14½ft. x 10½ft. x 9ft. floor to ceiling, plus 8½ft. x 8½ft. brick blast wall), concrete floor and roof, framed, braced and sheeted door in two leaves.
33 & 38	Standard Nissen huts (36ft. x 16ft.) with wood ends, tar-mac floor in 33 and concrete floor in 38.
37	7 Bay Nissen hut (42ft. x 16ft.), one wood end.
39	Brick building (30ft. x 17½ft. inclusive of blast walls 7½ft. to lower eaves), cement rendered to exterior corrugated asbestos to lean-to roof, concrete floor.
40	Wood framed building (30ft. x 15ft. x 7ft. to eaves) with galvanised corrugated iron to walls and pitched roof, two ledged and sheeted doors, each in two leaves.

Tenders are invited for the purchase of each of these buildings and their removal from the site. In-

tending purchasers may tender for all or any of the buildings, but a separate price for each building must be quoted.

The buildings may be seen between the hours of 10.00 a.m. and 4.00 p.m. on Monday, the 15th May, 1950, when an officer of the Ministry will be in attendance. Forms of tender and conditions of sale may be obtained from this officer.

Tenders should reach the Ministry of Commerce, Chichester House, Room 34A, Chichester Street, Belfast, on or before 4.00 p.m. on Friday, the 19th day of May, 1950.

The Ministry is not bound to accept the highest or any tender.

HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE

NOTICE is hereby given, in pursuance of the Second Schedule to the Factories Act (Northern Ireland), 1938, that the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance for Northern Ireland proposes to make special Regulations under Section 65 of the said Act and Section 8 of the Factories Act (Northern Ireland), 1949, prescribing precautions to be taken in connection with blasting of castings and other articles in factories.
