A PROCLAMATION

For Appointing Thursday, 12th July, 1951,  
a Bank Holiday and a Public Holiday  
in Northern Ireland.

I, William Spencer, Earl Granville, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Vice-Admiral Governor of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the Bank Holidays Act, 1871, the Holidays Extension Act, 1875, and the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, and of every power Me thereunto enabling, do hereby appoint Thursday, the 12th day of July next, as a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday and as a Public Holiday in Northern Ireland, under and in accordance with the said Acts, and I do by this Proclamation command the said day to be so observed, and all loving subjects of His Majesty to order themselves accordingly.

WHEREAS by Sub-section (5) of Section 2 of the National Assistance Act (Northern Ireland), 1948, it is provided that the constitution and proceedings of the National Assistance Board for Northern Ireland shall be governed by the provisions set out in the First Schedule to that Act.

AND WHEREAS by the said First Schedule it is provided that the National Assistance Board for

Northern Ireland shall consist of a Chairman and not less than one nor more than four other members appointed by the Governor of Northern Ireland.

AND WHEREAS the term of office of the several members of the Board as constituted terminated on 30th June, 1951.

to be members of the said Board from 1st July, 1951, until 30th June, 1952.
