CEREMONIAL OBSERVED AT THE RECEPTION AND THE SWEARING IN OF VICE-ADMIRAL THE EARL GRANVILLE, K.C.V.O., C.B., D.S.O., AS GOVERNOR OF NORTHERN IRELAND ON 7TH SEPTEMBER, 1951.

Vice-Admiral the Earl Granville, on entering the Royal Courts of Justice, Belfast, was received by the Right Honourable the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland.

The Earl Granville was conducted to the Nisi Prius Court where His Majesty's Judges, Ministers of Northern Ireland and other members of the Privy Council, His Majesty's Lieutenants, The Right Honourable the Lord Mayor of Belfast, Magistrates, Members of Parliament, representatives of the Churches, the Services and Local Government and other persons were assembled.

His Majesty's Commission of Appointment of the Earl Granville as Governor of Northern Ireland was presented to the Lord Chief Justice by the Clerk of the Privy Council.

After the Commission of Appointment was read in the presence of the assembled company by the Prime Minister of Northern Ireland, the Oath of Allegiance and the Official Oath were administered to the Earl Granville by the Lord Chief Justice.

The Earl Granville took and subscribed the Oath of Allegiance and the Official Oath and proceeded with the Prime Minister, the Members of the Cabinet and the Clerk of the Privy Council to hold a Meeting of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland.
