virtue of the provisions of the said Acts delegate for the period of Our illness to the said Counsellors of State that is to say to Our Consort The Queen The Princess Elizabeth Duchess of Edinburgh The Princess Margaret The Duke of Gloucester and The Princess Royal the Royal functions hereinafter specified to be exercised jointly by not less than two of their number subject to the condition that they shall not act in any matter or thing on which it is signified by Us or appears to them that Our special approval should previously be obtained and accordingly We do by these Presents delegate and grant unto the said Counsellors of State or any two of them full power and authority during the period of Our illness to summon and hold on Our behalf Our Privy Council and to signify thereat Our approval of any matter or thing to which Our approval in Council is required and further to approve and sign on Our behalf commissions for signifying the Royal Assent to Acts of Parliament except an Act touching any of the matters for which provision is made in the Act of Settlement or touching Our Royal Style and Titles and to approve and sign on Our behalf any proclamation warrant fiat submission or other document requiring our Signature which relates to the affairs of Our United Kingdom or to the affairs of any of Our Colonies or any Territories under Our protection or in which We have jurisdiction in cases where Our Government in the United Kingdom is responsible for the foreign affairs of such Colonies or Territories and to do on Our behalf any matter or thing required to be done in relation to any such proclamation warrant fiat submission or other document and further to do on Our behalf any matter or thing which by virtue of Our Royal Prerogative or of any statutory or other power We are authorised to do for the safety or good government of Our United Kingdom any of Our said Colonies or any of the said Territories save only that as provided in the said Act they the said Counsellors of State shall not have power to dissolve Parliament otherwise than on Our express instructions and shall not grant any rank title or dignity of the peerage and further that they shall not receive any homage required to be done to Ourselves and shall not approve and sign any warrant fiat submission or other document set out in the Schedule hereunto annexed Commanding all and singular Archbishops Dukes Marquesses Earls Viscounts Bishops Baronets Knights Citizens and Burgesses and all other Our

Officers Ministers and Subjects that in everything appertaining to the matters aforesaid they be attendant counselling and helping the said Counsellors of State as it behoves them

In Witness whereof We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent Witness Ourselves at Westminster the Twenty-seventh day of September in the fifteenth year of Our Reign

PETTY SESSIONS DISTRICTS

Order dated 23rd July, 1951, made by the Ministry of Home Affairs under sub-section (1) of section eleven of the Summary Jurisdiction and Criminal Justice Act (Northern Ireland), 1935.

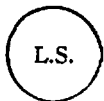
WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section eleven of the Summary Jurisdiction and Criminal Justice Act (Northern Ireland), 1935, it is provided that the Ministry of Home Affairs may from time to time by Order declare that, from such date as may be specified in that behalf in the Order, two or more Petty Sessions districts, whether they are all situate in the same County or not, shall be served by one and the same person as Petty Sessions Clerk;

AND WHEREAS it appears to the Ministry to be desirable that the Petty Sessions Districts of Omagh, Dromore, Fintona, Sixmilecross, Kesh and Trillick shall be served by one and the same person as Petty Sessions Clerk; and that the Petty Sessions Districts of Enniskillen, Letterbreen, Derrygonnelly, Lisbellaw, Irvinestown and Belleek shall be served by one and the same person as Petty Sessions Clerk;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Ministry of Home Affairs in pursuance of the powers vested in it by sub-section (1) of section eleven of the Summary Jurisdiction and Criminal Justice Act (Northern Ireland), 1935, hereby orders as follows:—

- (1) From and after the 26th day of July, 1951—the Petty Sessions Districts of Omagh, Dromore, Fintona, Sixmilecross, Kesh and Trillick, shall be served by one and the same person as Petty Sessions Clerk;
- (2) From and after the 1st day of August, 1951—the Petty Sessions Districts of Enniskillen, Letterbreen, Derrygonnelly, Lisbellaw, Irvinestown and Belleek shall be served by one and the same person as Petty Sessions Clerk.

This Order may be cited as the Summary Jurisdiction (Petty Sessions Districts) Order (Northern Ireland), 1951.

SUGAR CONFECTIONERY & FOOD PRESERVING WAGES COUNCIL (NORTHERN IRELAND)

further declare, that, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, We have given Order that Our Chancellor of Great Britain and Our Governor of Northern Ireland do respectively, upon Notice thereof, forthwith issue out Writs, in due Form and according to Law, for calling a new Parliament: And We do hereby also, by this Our Royal Proclamation under Our Great Seal of Our Realm, require Writs forthwith to be issued accordingly by Our said Chancellor and Governor respectively, for causing the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons who are to serve in the said Parliament to be duly returned to, and give their Attendance in, Our said Parliament on Wednesday the Thirty-first day of October instant which Writs are to be returnable in due course of law.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this Fifth day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifty-one, and in the Fifteenth year of Our Reign.
