## WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945

Aerated Waters Wages Council (Northern IRELAND)

The Aerated Waters Wages Council (Northern Ireland) hereby gives notice of its intention to sub-mit to the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance proposals for the revocation of the Aerated Waters Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation Order, 1951 (S.R. & O. 1951, No. 14), and for the fixing of statutory minimum remuneration in substitution for the statutory minimum remuneration at present payable.

Particulars of the proposals may be obtained from the Secretary of the Wages Council at the address given below.

The Wages Council will consider any written representations with respect to the above-mentioned proposals which may be sent to it within twenty-one days from the 7th December, 1951. Any such representation should be signed by the person making the same (adding his or her address) and sent to the Secretary, Aerated Waters Wages Council (Nor-thern Ireland), Tyrone House, Ormeau Avenue, Belfast. It is desirable that persons making objec-tions should state the precise grounds of their objections.

### MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE NORTHERN IRELAND

Agricultural Returns Act (Northern Ireland), 1939

The Ministry of Agriculture hereby gives notice that under Section I (2) of the Agricultural Returns Act (Northern Ireland), 1939, every occupier of any agricultural land or the person having the manage-ment on behalf of the occupier of any agricultural land in Northern Ireland is required to furnish to the Ministry on demand a return showing particulars of the area under crops, numbers of livestock and

poultry, numbers of agricultural machines and implements and numbers of persons employed in agricul-ture on such land as at the prescribed day. The "prescribed day" for the purposes of this return under the Act is the first day of January, 1952.
