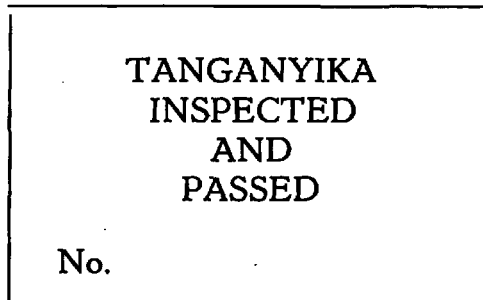
PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD) REGULATIONS  
(NORTHERN IRELAND), 1937 AND 1948

The Ministry of Health and Local Government gives notice in pursuance of the above-named Regulations that it hereby recognises the Official Certificate of which particulars are given in the Schedule hereto as showing (a) that the meat from which the meat product to which the Certificate relates was prepared, was derived from animals inspected ante and post mortem and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Ministry; and (b) that all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to public health were taken in the preparing and packing of the meat product.

The Certificate being in the form of a label or stamp, recognition will apply only if the label is securely affixed to, or the stamp is clearly impressed on, the package containing the meat product.
