CEREMONIAL OBSERVED ON THE ASSUMPTION OF THE OFFICE OF GOVERNOR OF NORTHERN IRELAND BY THE LORD WAKEHURST, K.C.M.G., ON 3RD DECEMBER, 1952.

The Lord Wakehurst was received on his arrival at the Royal Courts of Justice (Ulster) by the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland and conducted to the Nisi Prius Court where Her Majesty's Judges, Ministers of Northern Ireland and other Members of the Privy Council, Her Majesty's Lieutenants, The Right Honourable the Lord Mayor of Belfast, Magistrates, Members of Parliament, representatives of the Churches, of the Services and of Local Government and other persons were assembled.

Her Majesty's Commission of Appointment of the Lord Wakehurst as Governor of Northern Ireland, was presented to the Lord Chief Justice by the Clerk of the Privy Council.

After the Commission of Appointment was read in the presence of the assembled company by the Prime Minister of Northern Ireland, the Oath of Allegiance and the Official Oath were administered to the Lord Wakehurst by the Lord Chief Justice.

The Lord Wakehurst took and subscribed the Oath of Allegiance and the Official Oath and proceeded with the Prime Minister, the Members of the Cabinet and the Clerk of the Privy Council to hold a Meeting of the Executive Committee of Northern Ireland.
