### RETAIL BESPOKE TAILORING WAGES COUNCIL (NORTHERN IRELAND)

The Retail Bespoke Tailoring Wages Council (Northern Ireland) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance proposals for the revocation of the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation Order, 1950 (S.R. & O., 1950, No. 120), and for the fixing of statutory minimum remuneration in substitution for the statutory minimum remuneration at present payable.

**THE MANCHESTER PILOTAGE
