RANDALSTOWN AND DISTRICT NURSING ASSOCIATION

ROADS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1948

- (1) to stop-up to vehicular traffic the existing junction between the Belfast-Ballygawley-Londonderry Trunk Road (T.3) and Upper Falls Road (B.102);
- (2) to construct a length of new road from Upper Falls Road (B.102) to the Belfast-Ballygawley-Londonderry Trunk Road (T.3) in order to provide an alternative junction in substitution for the junction proposed to be stopped up.
