ROADS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1948

The Ministry of Commerce hereby gives notice in accordance with the provisions of the First Schedule to the Roads Act (Northern Ireland), 1948, that it proposes to make an Order under Section 3 of that Act the general effect of which will be to authorise the Ministry:

- (1) to stop-up to vehicular traffic the existing junction between the Belfast-Ballygawley-Londonderry Trunk Road (T.3) and Upper Falls Road (B.102);
- (2) to construct a length of new road from Upper Falls Road (B.102) to the Belfast-Ballygawley-Londonderry Trunk Road (T.3) in order to provide an alternative junction in substitution for the junction proposed to be stopped up.

Details of the junction it is proposed to stop-up and the new road it is proposed to construct are delineated on a map, a copy of which, together with a copy of the draft Order, may be inspected by any person free of charge at all reasonable hours during a period of 40 days from the 14th day of January, 1955, at either of the undermentioned offices:—Ministry of Commerce, Chichester House, Chichester Street, Belfast; Antrim County Council, County Courthouse, Crumlin Road, Belfast.
