NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACT, 1924.

The National Health Insurance Joint Committee and the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland hereby give notice that it is proposed to make a Special Order under paragraph (d) of Part I of the First Schedule to the National Health Insurance Act, 1924, excluding from the operation of that Act the employments under Local and Public Authorities set out in the Schedule hereto.

A draft of the proposed Order may be obtained, free of cost, on application to the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland, 7 Upper Queen Street, Belfast.

Objections to the draft Order by or on behalf of any person affected by its provisions must be sent in writing within twenty-one days from the date of this notice to the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland at the above address.

SCHEDULE.

Employment under any Local or other Public Authority:

- (a) In any pensionable office in a permanent capacity
- (b) As chaplain or other minister of religion;
- (c) As duly qualified medical practitioner;(d) As coroner or deputy-coroner;
- e) As public analyst;
- (f) As public vaccinator; (g) As registrar, assistant-registrar, or deputy registrar of Births, Marriages, and
- (h) Under a contract of apprenticeship without money payment;
- Employment under a Board of Guardians.
- As a pauper;
- (b) In rearing boarded-out pauper children;

Employment under any Local or other Public Authority not being employment within the meaning of Part I (a), (b), (c) or (e) of the First Schedule to the Act, in the execution of contracts not requiring personal service on the part of the employed person.

Employment as a pilot under the Londonderry Port and Harbour Commissioners.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACT, 1924.

The National Health Insurance Joint Committee and the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland hereby give notice, pursuant to the provisions of Section 94 of the National Health Insurance Act, 1924, that it is proposed to make a Special Order under paragraph (c) of Part I of the First Schedule to the National Health Insurance Act, 1924, excluding from the operation of that Act Outworkers of the classes or description specified in the Schedule

And the said Joint Committee hereby give further notice that it is proposed, with the approval of the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland, to make a Special Order under the proviso to Section 1 (2) of the said Act providing for the inclusion among the persons employed within the meaning of that Act of any person employed as an outworker by an employer who has given notice that he proposes to adopt the method of paying contributions in respect of outworkers in Northern Ireland by reference to the amount of work done, i.e., the "Unit" method, subject to the condition that such person performs not less than sixteen units
