## THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section seventeen of the Finance Act, 1924, that, subject to the provisions of that section, a game certificate or a gun licence taken out in Northern Ireland shall, without further payment of duty be available in Great Britain:

And Whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that the said section seventeen shall come into operation on the date which is declared by His Majesty in Council to be the date as on which by virtue of legislation passed by the Parliament of Northern Ireland a corresponding concession with respect to the availability in Northern Ireland of game licences and gun licences taken out in Great Britain comes into operation:

And Whereas by section six of the Finance (Northern Ireland) Act, 1924, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of that section a game licence or a gun licence taken out in Great Britain shall without further payment of duty, be available in Northern Ireland: And Whereas by the said last-mentioned

Act it is further enacted that the said section six shall come into operation on the first day of

January, nineteen hundred and twenty-five: Now, Therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, that the first day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, is for the purposes of section seventeen of the Finance Act, 1924, the date as on which by virtue of legislation passed by the Parliament of Northern Ireland a corresponding concession with respect to the availability in Northern Ireland of game licences and gun licences taken out in Great Britain comes into operation.
