This Order and the said report in detail and the said Ordnance plans submitted by the Boundary Surveyor shall remain on record in the office of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland at Stormont, and shall be exhibited to any persons who may desire to inspect the same, without fee or reward; and a copy of this Order, with copies of the said report and Ordnance plans certified under the hand of the Clerk of the said Council, shall be transmitted to the Clerk of the Crown and Peace for the County of Armagh to be kept by him and preserved in his office and exhibited at all reasonable hours to any persons who may desire to inspect the same, without fee or reward.

4. This Order shall be published in the *Belfast Gazette*.

#### STATUTORY RULES AND ORDERS OF NORTHERN IRELAND

1957. No. 3

#### CIVIL AUTHORITIES (SPECIAL POWERS) ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1922-43

Regulations, dated 11th January, 1957, made by the Minister of Home Affairs under sub-section (3) of Section One of the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Act (Northern Ireland), 1922.

WHEREAS by virtue of the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Act (Northern Ireland), 1922, there are in force certain Regulations for peace and order in Northern Ireland being:—

- (a) Regulations contained in the Schedule to that Act, and
- (b) Regulations made by the Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland pursuant to powers conferred by sub-section (3) of Section One of the said Act

(which Regulations were contained in the Schedule or made as aforesaid are hereinafter referred to as the "principal Regulations"):

And whereas the said Minister is empowered by the said sub-section (3) to make Regulations for making further provision for the preservation of the peace and maintenance of order and any Regulations so made shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, have effect and be in force in like manner as Regulations contained in the Schedule to that Act:

And whereas it is expedient that further provision for the preservation of the peace and maintenance of order should be made:

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable W. W. B. Topping, Q.C., Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by the said sub-section, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. At the end of Regulation 32 of the principal Regulations there shall be inserted the following Regulations:—

"33. The Civil Authority may by order prohibit, restrict or regulate in any area the use of vehicles or any class of vehicles on highways or the use by vehicles of specified roads or classes of roads, either generally or in such circumstances as may be specified.

34. The Civil Authority, and any person duly authorised by him, shall have right of access to any land or buildings or other property whatsoever.

34A. It shall be lawful for the Civil Authority and any person duly authorised by him:—

- (a) to take possession of any land and to construct works, including roads, thereon, and to remove any trees, hedges, and fences therefrom;
- (b) to take possession of any buildings or other property;
- (c) to take such steps as may be necessary for placing any buildings or structures in a state of defence;
- (d) to cause any buildings or structures to be destroyed or any property to be moved from one place to another, or to be destroyed;
- (e) to do any other act involving interference with private rights of property."

2. These Regulations may be cited as The Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Acts (Amending) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1957.

##### MINISTRY OF COMMERCE

#### ROADS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1948

The Ministry of Commerce hereby gives notice in accordance with the provisions of the First Schedule to the Roads Act (Northern Ireland), 1948, that it proposes to make an order under section 3 of that Act, the general effect of which will be to authorise the Ministry:—

1. In order to link the two unclassified roads hereinafter mentioned, to construct a new length of road commencing on the road D.R. 13 (Harmony Hill) at the point marked "A" in the townland of Magheralave, in the County of Antrim and extending therefrom to the road D.R. 20 (Moss Road) in the townlands of Magheralave and Lambeg North in the County of Antrim at the point marked "B" on the map hereinafter mentioned.
2. To provide a combined junction for the above-mentioned two roads with the Trunk Road T. 3 at the point "C" on the said map.
