CIVIL AUTHORITIES (SPECIAL POWERS) ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1922 TO 1943

WHEREAS by Regulation 8 of the regulations to which the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Acts (Northern Ireland), 1922 to 1943, apply (being a regulation made by the Minister of Home Affairs and having effect and to be enforced in like manner as regulations contained in the Schedule to the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Act (Northern Ireland), 1922) it is provided that if it appears to the Minister of Home Affairs that the publication or continued publication of any newspaper, periodical, book, circular or other printed matter is prejudicial to or likely to be prejudicial to the preservation of the peace and the maintenance or order in Northern Ireland, the said Minister may by orders prohibit for any specified period the publication of any such newspaper, periodical, book, circular or other printed matter:

And Whereas it is further provided by the said Regulations that if any person shall, within such specified period, print, publish, circulate or distribute or be in any way concerned in the printing, publication, circulation or distribution of any newspaper, periodical, book, circular or other printed matter, the publication of which has been prohibited under the said Regulation, he shall be guilty of an offence against the regulations to which the aforesaid Acts apply:

And Whereas it appears to me, the said Minister, that the publication or continued publication of the printed matter hereafter in this order specified is prejudicial to or likely to be prejudicial to the preservation of the peace and the maintenance of order in Northern Ireland:

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable W. W. B. Topping, Q.C., Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Acts (Northern Ireland), 1922 to 1943, and the said Regulation 8, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby order that the publication and distribution of the printed matter entitled:—

"THE IRISH REPUBLICAN BULLETIN"

under this title or under any other title or description whatever, or any part of the said printed matter, shall be, and is hereby, prohibited in Northern

Ireland as from the 24th day of September, 1957, until the 31st day of December, 1959.

EXEMPTIONS FROM KEY INDUSTRY DUTY

The Treasury have made an Order under Section 10 (5) of the Finance Act, 1926, exempting the following articles from Key Industry Duty for the period beginning September 23, 1957, and ending February 18, 1958.

Synthetic organic chemicals, analytical reagents other fine chemicals, and chemicals manufactured by fermentation processes, the following:—

- Ambrettolide
- Butylchloral hydrate
- (-) Carvone
- 5-Ethyl-2-sulphanilamido-1:3:4 thiadiazole (a substituted arylsulphoamide)
- 3-Methylindole
- Pinacol (a hexanediol)
- Triethyl orthoacetate (an ethyl ester)
- Triethyl orthopropionate (an ethyl ester)

POST OFFICE OVERSEAS TELEGRAMS

Her Majesty's Postmaster General hereby gives notice that the rates of charge and routes available for telegrams from the United Kingdom, the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands to places abroad will, from the 1st October, 1957, be as shown in the tables hereunder.

Every service in respect of which a charge appears in the tables is at present available. Where no charge is indicated under any heading in respect of a particular destination the relative service is not at present available. The services available to particular destinations abroad are, however, liable to be suspended and the restrictions imposed are liable to be varied from time to time by any of the telegraph administrations and private operating agencies concerned. Subject to any such restrictions telegrams may be sent to every one of the destinations in the appropriate table over the routes specified.

Except where otherwise stated the service of urgent telegrams is available at a rate per word equal to twice the rate per word for a telegram to the same destination over the same route sent at the ordinary rate.

Where the total amount of the charge for a telegram would include an odd number of farthings the charge is raised to the next higher halfpenny.

The service of delivery on ornamental forms (LX) is available to the destinations indicated.

The route abbreviations "Govt" or "Imperial" or "via Ldn. C.T.O." signify that the telegram is dealt with in the U.K. by the Post Office. The route abbreviations "Commercial", "Northern", "P.Q." and "Western Union" signify that the telegram is handed over in the U.K. by the Post Office to the Commercial Cable Company, the Great Northern Telegraph Company, the French Telegraph Cable Company, or the Western Union Telegraph Company respectively, for further treatment.

MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926

MARKING OF IMPORTED REFRACTORY BRICKS, BLOCKS AND TILES

The Board of Trade announce changes to part of the provisions of the Merchandise Marks Order affecting the marking of certain imported refractory bricks, blocks and tiles.

The changes are in respect of imported refractory bricks, blocks and tiles other than metallic bricks, blocks and tiles and refractory bricks, blocks and tiles cast from molten material. From September 17, 1957, such goods may be marked with an indication of origin by stencilling or painting in a contrasting colour either on each brick, block or tile, or (when the goods are imported or subsequently sold in containers) on the outside of the container.

These changes are affected by a Direction made by the Board of Trade under the authority of Section 3 (1) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926. The Direction modifies the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 4 Order, 1930 (S.R. & O. 1930 No. 527) as amended by the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 4 Order, 1930 (Amendment Order), 1937, (S.R. & O. 1937 No. 720). The Direction is entitled the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 4 Order, 1930 (Provisional Exemption) Direction, 1957, (S.I. 1957 No. 1641) and can be obtained from H.M. Stationery Office, Kingsway, London, W.C.2, and branches, price 3d. net, by post 5d. net.

The Direction affords temporary relief only. The question whether this relief should be continued by an amendment to the Order in question is being referred to the Standing Committee appointed by the Board under Section 4 of the Act.

MINUTE DETERMINING THE CONDITIONS UPON WHICH (I) GOVERNMENT LOANS MAY BE REDEEMED BEFORE THEIR DUE DATES OF REPAYMENT; AND (II) A REDUCTION IN THE RATE OF INTEREST APPLICABLE TO GOVERNMENT LOANS MAY BE EFFECTED

I. The Ministry of Finance has had under further consideration the terms upon which repayment of loans made from the Government Loans Fund to Local Authorities and other borrowers can be accepted in advance of the date at which, in accordance with the terms agreed to by the borrower at the time when the loan was made, the principal of such loans fall due for repayment.

Having regard to the intention of Parliament, as embodied in the Statutes governing the Fund, that the Fund should be safeguarded as far as possible against loss, and to the importance of maintaining the general principles that borrowers repaying in advance of the due date should repay an amount sufficient to liquidate the liability incurred by the Fund, in respect of the advance, and to provide against loss on the re-issue from the Fund of the principal of loans so repaid, the Ministry of Finance hereby determines as follows:

Repayment in advance of the due date of loans made from the Government Loans Fund at rates of interest exceeding 6½ per cent. per annum, shall be effected by the transfer to the Fund of an amount of cash representing the present value of the future annuity repayments (or payments of equal instalments of principal with diminishing interest) still remaining to be made to the Government Loans Fund under the terms agreed to by the borrower at the time when the loan was made, such present value being calculated by discounting the half-yearly instalments of annuity (or other half-yearly payments) at a rate of 3½ per cent. per half-year.

Provided always that the Ministry may accept (subject to due notice being received) repayment of principal at any time on the basis of £100 cash

for each £100 principal outstanding, in the following cases, namely:

- (1) The outstanding balance of loans issued at rates not in excess of 6½ per cent. per annum.
- (2) Unexpended balances of loans already advanced, where the Ministry is satisfied that the balance is unexpended either because the scheme for which the loan was issued was less costly than was anticipated, or because it has been definitely reduced in extent and also that application for repayment of the amount to the Government Loans Fund is made within five years from the date of its issue therefrom.
- (3) Loans issued to individuals and subject to repayment over a period of not more than 35 years.
- (4) Loans issued under the Glebe Loans (Ireland) Acts.

II. The Ministry of Finance hereby determines that a reduction in the rate of interest applicable to any loan advanced at a rate of interest exceeding 6½ per cent. per annum from the Government Loans Fund may be effected by the transfer to the Fund, of: an amount of premium representing the difference between the present value of the future annuity payments (or payments of equal instalments of principal with diminishing interest) still remaining to be made to the Government Loans Fund under the terms agreed to by the borrower at the time when the loan was made (such present value being calculated by discounting the half-yearly instalments of annuity or other half-yearly payments, at a rate of 3½ per cent. per half-year), and the present value of the proposed future half-yearly instalments (calculated at the reduced rate of interest proposed) also discounted at a rate of 3½ per cent. per half-year.

All other Minutes on the subjects of I and II are hereby revoked.

*Loans for the repayment of existing loans under paragraph (a) (ii) of Part I of this Notice will be made only in respect of loans obtained otherwise than from the Government Loans Fund, and where the rate of interest on the existing loan exceeds 6½ per cent.

II. LAND AND WORKS LOANS

- Loans for periods exceeding 5 years, but not exceeding 50 years, 6½ per cent.
- (b) Loans for the equipment of such schools as aforesaid:
- Loans for periods not exceeding 5 years, 7½ per cent.
- Loans for periods exceeding 5 years, but not exceeding 10 years 6½ per cent.

IV. OTHER LOANS

The rates of interest to be charged on loans other than those defined in Parts I, II and III of this Notice will be determined by the Ministry of Finance according to the circumstances of each individual case.

METHOD OF REPAYMENT

Local and Public Loans as defined in Part I of this Notice will be repayable as the Ministry of Finance may determine, either (i) by equal half-yearly instalments of the principal advanced, together with interest on the balance of principal from time to time outstanding; (ii) by equal half-yearly instalments of annuities calculated to include interest at the rates specified.

Loans defined in Parts II and III of this Notice will normally be repayable by equal half-yearly instalments of annuities calculated to include interest at the rates specified.

Other loans will be repayable by such methods as the Ministry of Finance may determine according to the circumstances.
