### CIVIL AUTHORITIES (SPECIAL POWERS) ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1922 TO 1943

WHEREAS by Regulation 8 of the regulations to which the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Acts (Northern Ireland), 1922 to 1943, apply (being a regulation made by the Minister of Home Affairs and having effect and to be enforced in like manner as regulations contained in the Schedule to the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Act (Northern Ireland), 1922) it is provided that if it appears to the Minister of Home Affairs that the publication or continued publication of any newspaper, periodical, book, circular or other printed matter is prejudicial to or likely to be prejudicial to the preservation of the peace and the maintenance or order in Northern Ireland, the said Minister may by orders prohibit for any specified period the publication of any such newspaper, periodical, book, circular or other printed matter:

And Whereas it is further provided by the said Regulations that if any person shall, within such specified period, print, publish, circulate or distribute or be in any way concerned in the printing, publication, circulation or distribution of any newspaper, periodical, book, circular or other printed matter, the publication of which has been prohibited under the said Regulation, he shall be guilty of an offence against the regulations to which the aforesaid Acts apply:

And Whereas it appears to me, the said Minister, that the publication or continued publication of the printed matter hereafter in this order specified is prejudicial to or likely to be prejudicial to the preservation of the peace and the maintenance of order in Northern Ireland:

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable W. W. B. Topping, Q.C., Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Acts (Northern Ireland), 1922 to 1943, and the said Regulation 8, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby order that the publication and distribution of the printed matter entitled:—

"THE IRISH REPUBLICAN BULLETIN"

under this title or under any other title or description whatever, or any part of the said printed matter, shall be, and is hereby, prohibited in Northern

Ireland as from the 24th day of September, 1957, until the 31st day of December, 1959.

### EXEMPTIONS FROM KEY INDUSTRY DUTY

The Treasury have made an Order under Section 10 (5) of the Finance Act, 1926, exempting the following articles from Key Industry Duty for the period beginning September 23, 1957, and ending February 18, 1958.

Synthetic organic chemicals, analytical reagents other fine chemicals, and chemicals manufactured by fermentation processes, the following:—

Ambrettolide  
Butylchloral hydrate  
(-) Carvone  
5-Ethyl-2-sulphanilamido-1:3:4 thiadiazole (a substituted arylsulphoamide)  
3-Methylindole  
Pinacol (a hexanediol)  
Triethyl orthoacetate (an ethyl ester)  
Triethyl orthopropionate (an ethyl ester)
