## POST OFFICE OVERSEAS TELEGRAMS

Her Majesty's Postmaster General hereby gives notice that the rates of charge and routes available for telegrams from the United Kingdom, the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands to places abroad will, from the 1st October, 1957, be as shown in the tables hereunder.

Every service in respect of which a charge appears in the tables is at present available. Where no charge is indicated under any heading in respect of a particular destination the relative service is mot at present available. The services available to particular destinations abroad are, however, liable to be suspended and the restrictions imposed are liable to be varied from time to time by any of the telegraph administrations and private operating agencies concerned. Subject to any such restrictions telegrams may be sent to every one of the destinations in the appropriate table over the routes specified.

Except where otherwise stated the service of urgent telegrams is available at a rate per word equal to twice the rate per word for a telegram to the same destination over the same route sent at the ordinary rate.

Where the total amount of the charge for a telegram would include an odd number of farthings the charge is raised to the next higher halfpenny.

The service of delivery on ornamental forms (LX) is available to the destinations indicated.

The route abbreviations "Govt" or "Imperial" or "via Ldn. C.T.O." signify that the telegram is dealt with in the U.K. by the Post Office. The route abbreviations "Commercial", "Northern", "P.Q." and "Western Union" signify that the telegram is handed over in the U.K. by the Post Office to the Commercial Cable Company, the Great Northern Telegraph Company, the French Telegraph Cable Company, or the Western Union Telegraph Company respectively, for further treatment.

The minimum charge for a European letter telegram to a particular destination permits of the transmission of 22 chargeable words and is equal to 22 times the relative rate per word shown in column III.
