The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Sections 1 and 19 of the Import Duties Act, 1932, Section 14 of the Finance Act, 1933, Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1934, and Section 1 of the Import Duties (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1939, viz:—

The Import Duties (Exemptions) (No. 6) Order, 1958, which extends the exemption from duty under the Import Duties Act, 1932, of wooden telegraph poles to cover longer and thicker poles, by removing the restrictions on maximum size.
