TRUNK ROAD IMPROVEMENT AT KILTERMON, CO. TYRONE

The Ministry of Commerce hereby gives notice that it proposes to construct two lengths of new road in substitution for the corresponding lengths of the existing Ballygawley-Enniskillen Trunk Road in the townlands of Gortmore, Kiltermon, Ranenly, Mullaghmore and Cullynane, Co. Tyrone. In accordance with the provisions of the First Schedule to the Roads Act (Northern Ireland), 1948, the Ministry also gives notice that it proposes to make an Order under Sections 1 and 3 of the Act, the general effect of which will be as follows:

1. The lengths of new road will become parts of the Ballygawley-Enniskillen Trunk Road on the date of coming into force of the Order.

2. On the first day of April next after the aforementioned lengths of new Trunk Road are opened for the purposes of through traffic, the corresponding lengths of the existing Trunk Road will cease to form part of the Trunk Road.

3. The Ministry will be authorised to stop up a number of junctions between the old and new Trunk Roads and between the new Trunk Road and the District Road No. 1413 and to provide, where required, new and safer junctions.

The aforementioned works are delineated on a map, a copy of which, together with a copy of the draft Order, may be inspected by any person, free

of charge, at all reasonable hours during a period of 40 days from the 6th day of January, 1960, at the following places:—
