TREASURY

IMPORT DUTIES ACT, 1958

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under Section 9 and 13 of, and Schedule 5 to, the Import Duties Act, 1958, viz:—The Import Duty Drawbacks (No. 2) Order, 1964.

This Order provides for the allowance of drawback of import duty on—

- (i) certain imported bones used in the manufacture of specified animal black for export.
- (ii) specified imported plywood used in the manufacture of certain plywood packing cases for export, and
- (iii) imported natural straw hoods used in the manufacture of panama hats for export.

This Order also provides for—

- (i) the alteration of the rates of drawback of import duty on imported linseed and linseed oil used in the manufacture of specified exported goods including printers' inks; and
- (ii) an increase in the rate of drawback of import duty on imported cadmium metal used in the manufacture of exported pigment.

The Order comes into operation on the 4th March, 1964, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1964, No. 252.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under Section 203 of the Customs and Excise Act 1952, viz:—The Hydrocarbon Oils Duties (Drawback) (No. 1) Order, 1964.

This Order provides for the allowance of drawback of customs or excise duty paid in respect of hydrocarbon oil used in the manufacture or preparation of tropical cork headgear. It replaces the drawback allowed in respect of tropical helmets by an allowance on a wider range of headgear, but at a lower rate. It also reduces the rate used for determining the quantity of hydrocarbon oil in respect of which drawback is allowed for a specified type of water-repellent agent for textiles.

BOARD OF TRADE

MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT 1926

Marking of Imported Electric Incandescent Lamps

The Board of Trade announce that in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by Section 3 of the Merchandise Marks Act 1926, they have given a Direction, namely, the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 2 Order 1928 (Provisional Exemption) Direction 1964 in regard to the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 2 Order 1928, as amended.

The Direction exempts imported electric incandescent lamps of the following description from having to bear an indication of origin as prescribed by the Order and permits the indication to be (i) indelibly stamped, embossed, incised or impressed on the cap of the lamp and (ii) indelibly marked on the carton, wrapper or other container in which the lamp is imported, sold or exposed for sale, as the case may be:—

Electric incandescent projection lamps having a glass bulb, the external surface of which is coated with an obscuring finish except for a clear area for light emission.

The Direction affords temporary relief only. The question whether the Order should be amended in

accordance with the terms of the Direction or otherwise is being referred to the Standing Committee appointed by the Board of Trade under Section 4 of the Merchandise Marks Act 1926.

URBAN DRAINAGE ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1957

Order confirming a Draft Urban Drainage Scheme for the improvement of the Tillysburn Stream adjoining the Holywood Road, Belfast.

Now Therefore the Ministry in exercise of the power contained in Section 5 (1) of the said Act by this Order confirms the Scheme.

SUPREME COURT

ELECTION PETITION RULES, 1964

Fermanagh, such notice to be received within 21 days of the date of seizure, or, where notice of the seizure is published in the Belfast Gazette, within ten days of such publication, whichever period shall terminate the later.

If no such claim is received as aforesaid the said Order provides that the livestock shall be deemed to be condemned as forfeited.
