## MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE

### THE AGRICULTURAL PRODUCE (MEAT REGULATION AND PIG INDUSTRY) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1962

Notice is hereby given that the Ministry of Agriculture, with the concurrence of the Ministry of Health and Local Government in so far as the Regulations relate to matters which may be dealt with by Regulations under the Food and Drugs Act (Northern Ireland) 1958, and with the approval of the Ministry of Finance as regards inspection fees, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 20 of the Agricultural Produce (Meat Regulation and Pig Industry) Act (Northern Ireland) 1962 and all other powers enabling it in that behalf made on the 20th March, 1964, the Meat Shipping Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1964.

These Regulations come into operation on the 27th April, 1964, and set out the requirements for and the conditions governing the registration of any premises from which meat is sent to Great Britain, the Isle of Man or the Republic of Ireland. They do not apply to any premises providing meat solely for consumption in Northern Ireland.

### DEVELOPMENT LOANS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1945

#### *Agricultural Development Loans*

It has been decided that the rate of interest charged on Agricultural Machinery Loans shall be increased by  $\frac{1}{2}$  per cent as from Saturday, 14th March, 1964, from  $8\frac{1}{4}$  per cent to  $8\frac{3}{4}$  per cent and that the rate of interest charged on all other loans shall be increased by  $\frac{1}{2}$  per cent as from the same date from  $5\frac{1}{2}$  per cent to  $6\frac{1}{2}$  per cent.

The new rates will apply to loans approved on or after the above date.

Notice is hereby given that the Ministry of Agriculture in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 9 of the Agriculture Act (Northern Ireland) 1949, and Section 2 of the Diseases of Animals Act (Northern Ireland) 1958, and with the approval of the Ministry of Finance on the 25th March, 1964, made an Order entitled Accredited Poultry Farms Scheme (Northern Ireland) 1964.

## MINISTRY OF COMMERCE

Minister of Commerce for Northern Ireland, do by this Minute appoint William Thomas McCrory of the Ministry to be an Assistant Registrar of Business Names for Northern Ireland to assist the officer of the Ministry who shall from time to time hold the office of Registrar of Business Names for Northern Ireland in the exercise of his powers and duties as such Registrar.
