#### WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY ACT, 1949

*To All Holders of Amateur (Sound) Licences and Amateur (Sound Mobile) Licences*

The Postmaster General hereby gives notice that on and from the 1st day of June, 1964, all licences as amended from time to time of the above mentioned types granted by him before the 29th day of May, 1964, shall be read, construed and take effect as if in the Schedule thereto under the heading "Frequency Bands (in Mc/s)" for the frequency band 70.2—70.4 there were substituted the frequency band 70.1—70.7 and for the Footnote 3 to the Schedule there were substituted the following Footnote 3.

3. This band is available to amateurs until further notice provided that —

- (i) only the frequency 70.375 Mc/s  $\pm$  25 Kc/s shall be used when the station is used during the disaster relief operations mentioned in the Licence or during any exercise relating to such operations;
- (ii) frequencies between 70.1—70.3 Mc/s inclusive and 70.5—70.7 Mc/s inclusive shall not be used on the North West side of the Line Firth of Lorne to the Moray Firth; and
- (iii) use by the Licensee of any frequency in the band shall cease immediately on the demand of a Government official.

#### PHARMACY AND POISONS

The Minister of Home Affairs on the 10th April, 1964, made the following Statutory Rule:—

"The Poisons (Fluoroacetamide and Fluoroacetanilide) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1964" which will come into operation on 1st June, 1964.

These Regulations further restrict the sales of fluoroacetamide and fluoroacetanilide and in particular, retail sales to purchasers are prohibited except for certain purposes of research or analysis or, on the production of a duly completed certificate in a prescribed form, for use as rodenticides. In addition

the exemption from the special restrictions apply to poisons in Schedule 1 to the principal Regulations hitherto enjoyed by certain solutions of these two substances is now removed.
