GOVERNMENT LOANS AND EXCHEQUER PROVISIONS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1925.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACT, 1924.

The National Health Insurance Joint Committee and the Ministry of Labour for Northern

Ireland hereby give notice that it is proposed to make a Special Order under paragraph (d) of Part I of the First Schedule to the National Health Insurance Act, 1924, excluding from the operation of that Act certain employments under Local and Public Authorities.

Objections to the draft Order by or on behalf of any person affected by its provisions must be sent in writing within twenty-one days from the date of this notice to the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland at the above address.

WIDOWS', ORPHANS', AND OLD AGE CONTRIBUTORY PENSIONS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1925.

The Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland hereby gives notice that it is proposed to make a Special Order under Sub-section 3 of Section 9 of the Widows', Orphans' and Old Age Contributory Pensions Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, providing that certain employments under any Local or other Public Authority which have been excluded from Part I of the First Schedule to the National Health Insurance Act, 1924, in pursuance of paragraph (d) of that Part shall be treated for the purposes of the Widows' Orphans' and Old Age Contributory Pensions Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, as if they were excepted employments mentioned in paragraph (iv) of Sub-section (i) of section 9 thereof, and to prescribe the conditions under which they shall be so treated.
