TRADE BOARDS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923.

ROPE, TWINE AND NET TRADE BOARD (NORTHERN IRELAND).

The Trade Board established under the powers vested in the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland, and in pursuance of Section 8 of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, and the Enactments modified and adapted by the Government of Ireland (Adaptation of Enactments) (No. 3) Order, 1921, and any other Order of His Majesty in Council made under the said Act of 1920 for those branches of the Rope, Twine and Net Trade defined in the Regulations of the said Ministry, dated the Second day of January, 1922, hereby give Notice that they propose to vary and to fix certain minimum rates of wages for female workers in the said trade.

On request to the Trade Board particulars of the proposed minimum rates above referred to, and information as to their application, will be given if, in the opinion of the Trade Board, the applicant is likely to be affected thereby.

The Trade Board will consider any objections which may be lodged with them within fourteen days from the Eighteenth day of February, 1926, in respect of their proposal to vary minimum rates, and within one calendar month from the Eighteenth day of February, 1926, in respect of their proposal to fix minimum rates. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Rope, Twine and Net Trade Board (Northern Ireland), Office of Trade Boards, 14 Bridge Street, Belfast.

It is desirable that persons making objections should state precisely, and, as far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

TRADE BOARDS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923.
BOOT AND SHOE REPAIRING TRADE BOARD

(NORTHERN IRELAND).

The Trade Board established by the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland under the powers conferred on it by the Trade Boards Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, for the Boot and Shoe Repairing Trade in Northern Ireland as defined in the Schedule to the Trade Boards (Boot and Shoe Repairing Trade, Northern Ireland) (Constitution, Proceedings and Meetings) Regulations, 1925, dated 30th July, 1925, hereby give notice that they propose to vary minimum rates of wages for certain classes of male and female workers in the trade.

On request to the Trade Board particulars of the proposed variation of minimum rates will be given if, in the opinion of the Trade Board, the applicant is likely to be affected thereby.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to their proposals which may be lodged with them within fourteen days from the fifteenth day of February, 1926. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Boot and Shoe Repairing Trade Board (Northern Ireland), Office of Trade Boards, 14 Bridge Street, Belfast. It is desirable that persons making objections should state precisely, and, as far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.
