PRICES AND INCOMES ACT 1966 Report on the National Board for Prices and Incomes

FLOUR PRICES

On 11th January 1968, in pursuance of their powers under section 2 (1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the Secretary of State for Economic Affairs and the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food referred the question of Flour Prices to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination.

The Board has now made its report, and in accordance with section 5 (1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966 the Secretary of State for Economic Affairs and the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food hereby give notice that the report was first published as Command Paper Number 3522 on 1st February, 1968.
