Viz: The Non-Residents' Transitional Relief from Income Tax on Dividends (Extension of Period) Order 1968.

This Order extends by one year the period during which relief is available under section 31, Finance Act 1966. This section gives relief from United Kingdom income tax on dividends paid by United Kingdom companies to residents of the overseas territories with which the United Kingdom has the Double Taxation Agreements listed in Schedule 9 to the same Act. The relief was originally given for the years 1966/67 and 1967/68, but provision was made in subsection 1 of the section for the extension of this period.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Section 32(1) of the Finance Act 1966.

Viz: The Transitional Relief for Interest and Royalties paid to Non-Residents (Extension of Period) Order 1968. This Order extends by one year the period during which relief is available under section 32, Finance Act 1966. This section ensures that certain payments to non-residents which are relieved from United Kingdom income tax under a Double Taxation Agreement are not treated as distributions for corporation tax purposes in the hands of the United Kingdom company making them. Viz: The Import Duty Drawbacks (No. 3) Order 1968.

Architects' Costs and Fees

DIRECTION UNDER SECTION 5(4) FURTHER EXTENDING THE PERIOD WITHIN WHICH THE NATIONAL BOARD FOR PRICES AND INCOMES MUST PUBLISH THEIR REPORT

Whereas the First Secretary of State and the Minister of Public Building and Works, in pursuance of their powers under section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act, 1966, referred the above-mentioned question to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination and have published the text of the reference in the Gazette on 11th April 1967;

2. And whereas by section 5(3) of the Act, but subject to section 5(4), the Board are required to make their report so as to allow publication within three months of the said date;

3. And whereas the First Secretary of State and the Minister of Public Building and Works, in pursuance of their powers under the said section 5(4), by a direction published in the Gazette on 6th July 1967, extended the said period of three months by nine months;

4. Now therefore, the Secretary of State for Economic Affairs and the Minister of Public Building and Works, in pursuance of their powers under the said section 5(4), hereby direct that the said period of three months be further extended by two months.

ANTRIM RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Clean Air Act (Northern Ireland) 1964

The Antrim (No. 1) Smoke Control Order 1968

1. Notice is hereby given that the Antrim Rural District Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 11 of the above-mentioned Act on the eighth day of February 1968, made an Order entitled the Antrim (No. 1) Smoke Control Order (Northern Ireland) 1968, declaring the area described in the schedule hereto to be a smoke control area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Ministry of Health & Social Services for confirmation.

Subject to the limitations and exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of Section 11 of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.
3. Copies of the Order, and of the Map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, Steeple, Antrim, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the fifth day of April, 1968.
4. Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by Notice in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Health & Social Services, Dundonald House, Belfast, BT4 3SF, object to the confirmation of the Order.
