Viz:—The Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 2) Order, 1968.

The Order provides that the goods listed in Schedule 1, mainly chemicals, shall be temporarily exempt from import duty, and those listed in Schedule 2, mainly chemicals, shall continue to be temporarily exempt from import duty until 1st January, 1969, except for items for which an earlier day is specified in the Order.

Viz:—The Import Duties (General) (No. 3) Order 1968.

This Order re-imposes an import duty of 1d. per linear foot (full rate), 2/9ths. of 1d. per linear foot (Commonwealth Preference Area rate) and NIL (E.F.T.A. and Irish Republic rates) on cinematograph film of a width of 16 millimetres bearing two positive prints, each of 8 millimetres, across the width.

It also redefines the term "light oils" to bring the definition for import duty purposes into line with that already applied to revenue duties by an amendment made in the Finance Act 1967 (Section 1(5) and Schedule 5).

This Order:

- (i) revokes the existing fixed rate of drawback of import duty for the following exported goods manufactured from the imported materials shown and provides for the drawback to be related to the duty paid on the quantity of imported materials actually used in their manufacture:

REPORT OF THE NATIONAL BOARD FOR PRICES AND INCOMES

Pay of Municipal Busmen

On 26th January, 1968, in pursuance of their powers under section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act, 1966, the Secretary of State for Economic Affairs and the Ministers of Labour and Transport referred for examination to the National Board for Prices and Incomes (a) the agreement of 14th December, 1967, which provided for an increase in pay for all adult employees in the municipal bus industry, and (b) the award made on 22nd January, 1968, by the Nottingham City Council to implement the above agreement from 4th February, 1968.

The Board has now made its report entitled "Pay of Municipal Busmen". In accordance with section 5(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act, 1966, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity and Minister of Labour, and Minister of Transport hereby give notice that the report was first published as Command Paper Number 3605 on 26th April, 1968.

PRICES AND INCOMES ACT 1966

Reference to the National Board for Prices and Incomes

ELECTRICITY SUPPLY INDUSTRY:

NATIONAL GUIDELINES COVERING PRODUCTIVITY PAYMENTS

The National Joint Industrial Council for the Electricity Supply Industry have concluded an Agreement setting out national guidelines for Productivity Payment Schemes covering industrial workers employed on the distribution side of the industry. This Agreement follows up the recommendations made in the National Board for Prices and Incomes Report No. 42 on the Pay of Electricity Supply Workers, and is intended to provide the framework on which local productivity schemes affecting these workers will be based.

In pursuance of their powers under section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity and the Minister of Power hereby refer the Agreement to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination with special reference to the needs of the industry and the possible implications for other groups of workers employed in the industry.

PRICES AND INCOMES ACT 1967

Notice under section 1(2)(a) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1967 of a proposal to make an Order under section 1(2)(b) of the said Act continuing a standstill under section 15(2) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966 on the implementation of an Agreement and an Award relating to terms and conditions of employment in the road passenger transport industry

- (a) the Agreement providing for increases with effect from the first full pay period following 14th December 1967 in the rates of pay of all adult employees in the road passenger transport industry previously covered by the National Joint Industrial Council for the road passenger transport industry, made on 14th December 1967 between the Federation of Municipal Passenger Transport Employers on the one hand and the Transport and General Workers' Union and the National Union of General and Municipal Workers on the other, and ratified by the National Joint Industrial Council for the road passenger transport industry on 11th January 1968; and
- (b) the Award made on 22nd January 1968 whereby the Nottingham City Council by its Transport Committee resolved to implement the terms of the said Agreement referred to in paragraph (a) above with effect from the pay week beginning on 4th February 1968.

The standstill referred to was continued under subsections (1) and (2)(a) of section 1 of the said Act of 1967 by virtue of a recommendation of the Board adverse to the said implementation contained in their Report on the said reference published on 26th April 1968.

Representations about the proposal may be made by or on behalf of employers or employees affected by the said Agreement or Award or by or on behalf of any employers' organisation, trade union or trade union organisation directly or indirectly representing employers or employees so affected, to the Secretary of State in writing addressed to the Department of Employment and Productivity, 8 St. James's Square, London S.W.1, by 17th May 1968.

After that date and subject to the consideration of any representations duly made, the proposed Order may be made in the following terms—

And whereas before the said implementation ceased to be so forbidden a Report of the Board on the said Reference was published (Report No. 63 entitled “Pay of Municipal Busmen” (Cmnd. 3605) published 26th April, 1968), with a recommendation adverse to the implementation of Clause 1 of the said Agreement and to the implementation of the said Award:

And whereas by virtue of the said recommendation and subsections (1) and (2)(a) of section 1 of the Prices and Incomes Act 1967 (1967 c.53), the said section 15(2) continued to apply to the implementation of Clause 1 of the said Agreement and to the implementation of the said Award as it applied up to the date of publication of the said Report:

Now, therefore, the Secretary of State having given notice under section 1(2)(a) of the said Act of 1967 within a period of ten days after the date of the said publication, of a proposal to make this Order (and having taken into consideration representations duly made in pursuance of the said notice) in exercise of the powers conferred on her by section 1(2)(b) of the said Act of 1967 hereby makes the following Order:

1. (1) This Order which may be cited as the Awards and Settlements (Temporary Continuation of Standstill) (No. 1) Order 1968, shall come into operation on 1968.
- (2) The Interpretation Act 1889 (1889 c.63), shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
