

Import Duties Act 1958, and Section 2(5) of the Finance Act 1965.

Viz:—The Import Duty Drawbacks (No. 4) Order 1968.

This Order:

- (i) revokes the existing fixed rate of drawback of import duty for the following exported goods manufactured from the imported materials shown and provides for the drawback to be related to the duty paid on the quantity of imported materials actually used in their manufacture:

<i>Exported goods</i>	<i>Imported materials</i>
Fruit cakes, fruit puddings, biscuits and sweetmeat confectionery	Raisins, sultanas, currants and other dried grapes, and dried figs
Mincemeat, pickles, sauces and chutneys	Raisins, sultanas, currants and other dried grapes
Fig jam	Dried figs
Linseed oil, refined or heat treated or both; certain mixtures; adducts of linseed oil; and putty	Linseed oil

- (ii) Provides for the allowance of drawback of import duty on the exportation of a form of powdered sugar manufactured from imported sugar.

This Order comes into operation on 2nd May, 1968, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1968, No. 644.

## REGISTRAR OF RESTRICTIVE TRADING AGREEMENTS

### RESALE PRICES ACT 1964

*List No. 7 of classes of goods the subject of declarations by the Restrictive Practices Court under Section 5*

The Registrar of Restrictive Trading Agreements in pursuance of subsection (5) of Section 6 of the Resale Prices Act 1964 hereby publishes the following list of classes of goods in respect of which the Restrictive Practices Court has refused to make an Order directing that they shall be exempted goods for the purposes of the Act.

In this list "the Brussels Nomenclature" means the Convention on Nomenclature for the Classification of Goods in Customs Tariffs (Cmnd. 1070).

This list includes all classes of goods in respect of which the Court made declarations between 1st January and 5th April, 1968.

Ethyl methyl ketone, acetic acid and ethyl acetate, put up as thinners for use with polyester drafting, scribing or stripping materials, within headings 29.13 or 29.14 of the Brussels Nomenclature	5th April, 1968
Wadding, gauze, bandages and similar articles (including dressings, adhesive plasters and poultices), impregnated or coated with pharmaceutical substances or put up in retail packings for medical or surgical purposes, within heading 30.04 of the Brussels Nomenclature, but excluding the following products for use in dentistry: cotton wool pellets, cotton wool rolls, throat and mouth packs; and excluding tulle dressings medicated for human and veterinary use	23rd Feb., 1968

Sterile surgical sutures, including sutures with needles attached; fibre mesh and fascia lata strips for use in the surgical repair of hernia of the abdominal wall; collagen tape for use in the surgical treatment of dropped eyelid or stress incontinence of urine within heading 30.05 of the Brussels Nomenclature; non-sterile surgical sutures of silk, linen, cotton, man-made fibres or steel wire within headings 50.08, 51.02, 54.03, 54.04, 55.05, 55.06, 59.04, 73.14, 73.15 or 90.17 of the Brussels Nomenclature	
Photographic paints, varnishes, lacquers dyes, pigments and opacifiers (including retouching and spotting media and dyes and polyvinyl alcohol solutions); photographic colouring outfits; photographic tinting sheets; retouching fluids for polyester drafting, scribing or stripping materials; all within headings 32.08, 32.09 or 32.10 of the Brussels Nomenclature	5th April, 1968
Aerosol spray-on surgical bandaging medium containing a plastic base within heading 32.09 of the Brussels Nomenclature	23rd Feb., 1968
Ink prepared for use in photographic processing, within heading 32.13 of the Brussels Nomenclature	5th April, 1968
Carpet and upholstery shampoos, within heading 34.02 of the Brussels Nomenclature	23rd Feb., 1968
Organic surface-acting wetting agents and antistatic solutions for use in photography and photographic processing; decoating solutions, image eradicators and corrector fluids for use in lithographic processing; photographic-lens cleaning solutions; all within heading 34.02 of the Brussels Nomenclature	5th April, 1968
