ASSUMPTION OF THE OFFICE OF
GOVERNOR OF NORTHERN IRELAND BY
THE LORD GREY OF NAUNTON, G.C.M.G.,
K.C.V.O., O.B.E., ON 3rd DECEMBER, 1968

The Lord Grey of Naunton was received on his arrival at the Royal Courts of Justice (Ulster) by the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland.

The Lord Grey took the Oath of Allegiance and the Official Oath before members of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland.

His Excellency entered the Nisi Prius Court where Her Majesty's Judges, Ministers of Northern Ireland and other Members of the Privy Council, Her Majesty's Lieutenants, the Deputy Lord Mayor of Belfast, Magistrates, Members of Parliament, representatives of the Churches, of the Services and of Local Government and other persons were assembled.

After Her Majesty's Commission of Appointment of the Lord Grey of Naunton as Governor of Northern Ireland was read by the Prime Minister of Northern Ireland in the presence of the assembled company His Excellency subscribed the Oaths and proceeded with the Prime Minister, the Members of the Cabinet and the Clerk of the Privy Council to hold a Meeting of the Executive Committee of Northern Ireland.

Following a Classification Opinion of the Customs Cooperation Council, certain parts of glass envelopes for cathode ray tubes, hitherto classified in sub-heading 85.21(B) of the customs tariff, now become classifiable under heading 70.21. - (3) amends the provisions for the allowance of drawback of import duty on rolls of electro-sensitive recording paper so that the drawback is related to the total quantity of paper exported and not to the paper content of each roll;
- (4) revokes the provisions for the allowance of drawback of import duty on handbags manufactured from imported leather; and
- (5) revokes the existing fixed rates of drawback of import duty in respect of photographic film and prepared film base and provides for drawback to be related to the duty paid on the imported film base actually used in the manufacture of the exported goods.
