H.M. CUSTOMS AND EXCISE

To: Thomas Horan, Boherbee, Tralee, County Kerry,
Irish Free State.

Pursuant to section 275 (5) of the Customs and Excise Act, 1952 and paragraph 1 of the 7th Schedule thereto, the Commissioners of Customs and Excise hereby give you notice that by virtue of the powers contained in the customs and excise Acts and enactments amending those Acts, certain goods, namely one Austin Motor Car, registration number KIN 530, has been seized as liable to forfeiture upon the grounds that the said vehicle being goods chargeable with a duty of customs, on or about the 8th of November 1968, was temporarily imported into the United Kingdom by D. Rafferty and was allowed to be delivered without payment of that duty on condition that the vehicle was not sold while in the United Kingdom and the said condition was not observed, whereby and by force of section 257(1) of the Customs and Excise Act, 1952, the said goods are liable to forfeiture.

If you claim that the said goods are not liable to forfeiture you must within one month from the date of this notice of seizure give notice of your claim in accordance with the said Schedule to the said Act specifying the name and address of a solicitor in Northern Ireland who is authorised to accept service of process and to act on your behalf. In default of such notice the said goods will be deemed to have been duly condemned as forfeited and will be liable to be disposed of in such manner as the Commissioners of Customs and Excise may direct. If you make such claim within the time aforesaid, legal proceedings will be taken for the condemnation thereof.

CLEAN AIR ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1964

Downpatrick No. 1 Smoke Control Order (Northern Ireland) 1969

1.
