PRICES AND INCOMES ACT 1966

Manufacturers' Prices of Toilet Preparations

DIRECTION UNDER SECTION 5(4) EXTENDING THE PERIOD WITHIN WHICH THE NATIONAL BOARD FOR PRICES AND INCOMES MUST PUBLISH THEIR REPORT

Whereas the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity and the Board of Trade, in pursuance of their powers under section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, referred the above-mentioned question to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination and have published the text of the reference in the Gazette on 24th December 1968;

2. And whereas by section 5(3) of the Act, but subject to section 5(4), the Board are required to make their report so as to allow publication within three months of the said date;

3. Now, therefore, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity and the Board of Trade, in pursuance of their powers under the said section 5(4), hereby direct that the said period of three months be extended by three months.

MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE

The Official Certificate being in the form of a stamp, recognition will apply only if the stamp is clearly impressed or otherwise marked on the meat or the package containing the meat.

- (a) Portions of carcasses, with or without bone, comprising recognisable wholesale or retail cuts which contain no associated lymphatic gland or from which has been removed in preparing or trimming the meat, any pleura, peritoneum or lymphatic gland;
- (b) the tongue from any bovine animal from which a submaxillary lymphatic gland has been removed;
- (c) minced or chopped meat other than liver with or without the addition of any spices, cereal products, salt, flavouring, vegetable or other ingredient.

Recognition does not extend to boneless veal appearing to an authorised officer to be from calves less than three months old.

Recognition is extended until 31st May 1969, to include sheep and pig livers from which the lymphatic gland has been removed.
