Gazette dated 1st August, 1952, and in the Belfast Gazette dated 5th September 1952, for the importation of meat and meat products into Northern Ireland from Belgium, by extending that recognition to include meat of the following description:

In respect of beef, portions of carcases, with or without bone, comprising recognisable wholesale cuts which contain no associated lymphatic gland or from which has been removed, in preparing or trimming the meat, any lymphatic gland, or any part of the pleura or of the peritoneum.

Recognition does not extend to boneless veal appearing to an authorised officer to be from calves less than 3 months old.
